CELEBRATE EASTER



Read John 13:1-17 together. Then wrap a towel around your waist and wash your children's feet. Then talk with your kids about what it means for families to serve one another like Jesus served the

disciples. Come up with two practical ways you can serve each other this Easter weekend.

GOOD FRIDAY

Go outside with your kids and read the story of the crucifixion in John 19:1-37. Look for something purple, a thorn, some dirt and two branches for the cross. Discuss the meaning of each item in the story, and use dirt as an example of why Jesus had to die - that our sin makes us unclean in God's eyes, but Jesus' death washes us clean from our sin.



HOLY SATURDAY

Take a walk as the sun is setting, bring a flashlight, and as you walk find the largest rock you can. Read Mark 15:42-47. Discuss how Holy Saturday was a dark day because Jesus was still in the grave, and the stone was still in front of the tomb. Using the flashlight, share how even though this day is dark, Jesus is still the light of the world. (John 8:12)

EASTER SUNDAY



Supplies Needed: crescent rolls, marshmallows, cinnamon & sugar (or red sprinkles), melted butter.

As you start, quiz your kids about what happened on Good Friday after Jesus died. Spread out the crescent roll triangles individually on a baking sheet. Tell them these represent Jesus' tomb. Next roll one marshmallow first in butter and then in the sugar/cinnamon ixture. This represents Jesus'

body being prepared for burial with oil and spices. (You can use red sprinkles to represent blood instead of cinnamon if you want.) Place the spiced marshmallow in the center of the crescent roll wrap it up, and press the edges together so the crescent roll seals. This represents the tomb being sealed with the stone. Bake the crescent rolls according to the directions on the package. After they cool a bit, let your child open up one of the rolls. The marshmallow is gone - Jesus is alive!
